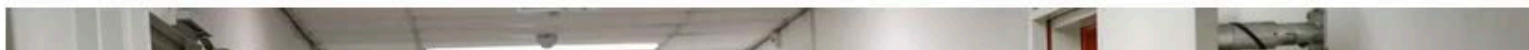

### Border Search of Electronic Devices at Ports of Entry

U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) is responsible for protecting our nation's borders and enforcing numerous laws at U.S. ports of entry. CBP's ability to lawfully inspect electronic devices crossing the border is integral to keeping America safe in an increasingly digital world.

All travelers crossing the United States border are subject to CBP inspection. On rare occasions, CBP officers may search a traveler's mobile phone, computer, camera, or other electronic devices during the inspection process.

Yes, the police will accelerate the identification of identity in the asylum procedure. The measures will be introduced immediately and mean that clothing and luggage examination will be included in the ID examination. If there is reason to do so, the police will immediately interview the foreigner. The police also have the option to read data carriers, such as telephones, if this is deemed necessary. In addition, the existing instruments have been tightened up: the document investigation by the Military Police, for example. These are also linked to the person deployed. That's all happening now.

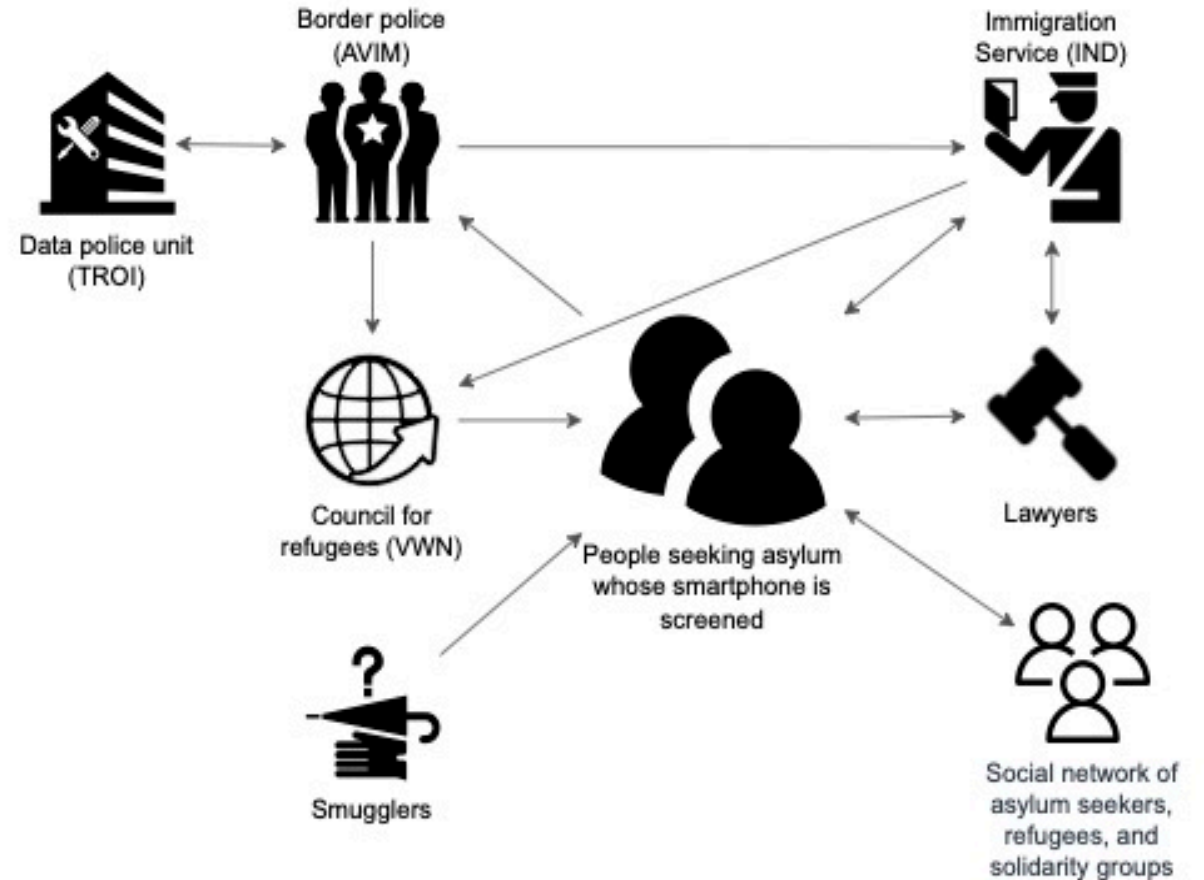

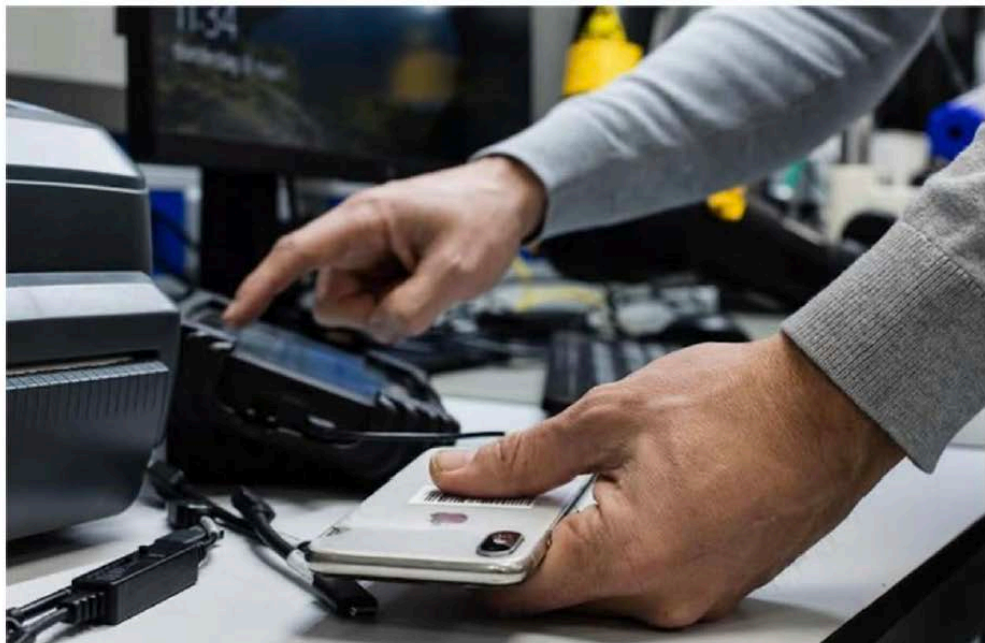

- Having to work with Non-Disclosure Agreements
- Acquiring and reverse-engineering second hand device hardware & software

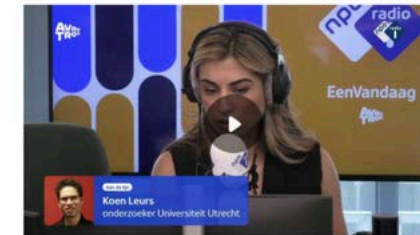



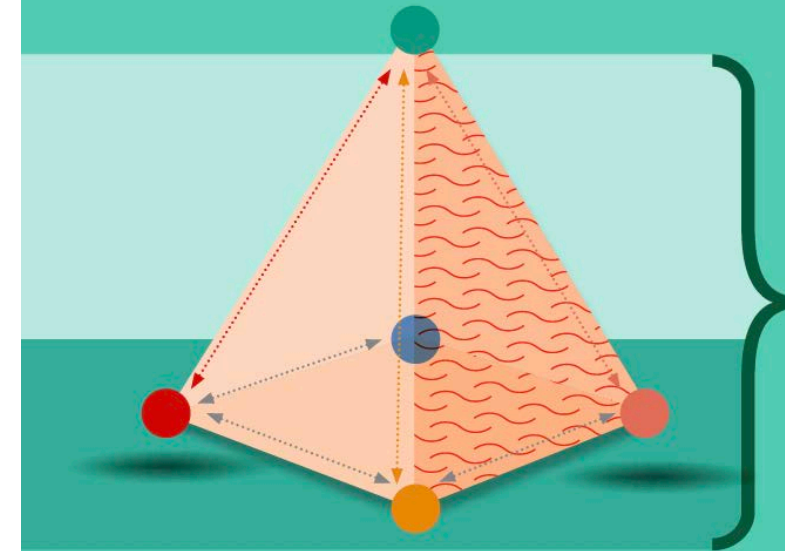

# Open science

Q&A on what you should comply with when applying for funding and implementing your project

Did you know that open science is a **legal obligation** under [Horizon Europe](#). Its purpose is to foster greater transparency and trust for the benefit of scientific research and for the benefit of EU citizens.

[...] include involving **all relevant knowledge actors** (including citizens)

**Citizen, civil society**, and end-user **engagement**: you should provide succinct information on how this engagement will be implemented in your project, where/if appropriate. This may include **co-design** activities (workshops or focus groups), co-creation activities (citizen science or user-led creation) and co-assessment activities (assisting monitoring, feedback, and evaluation of the governance of projects).

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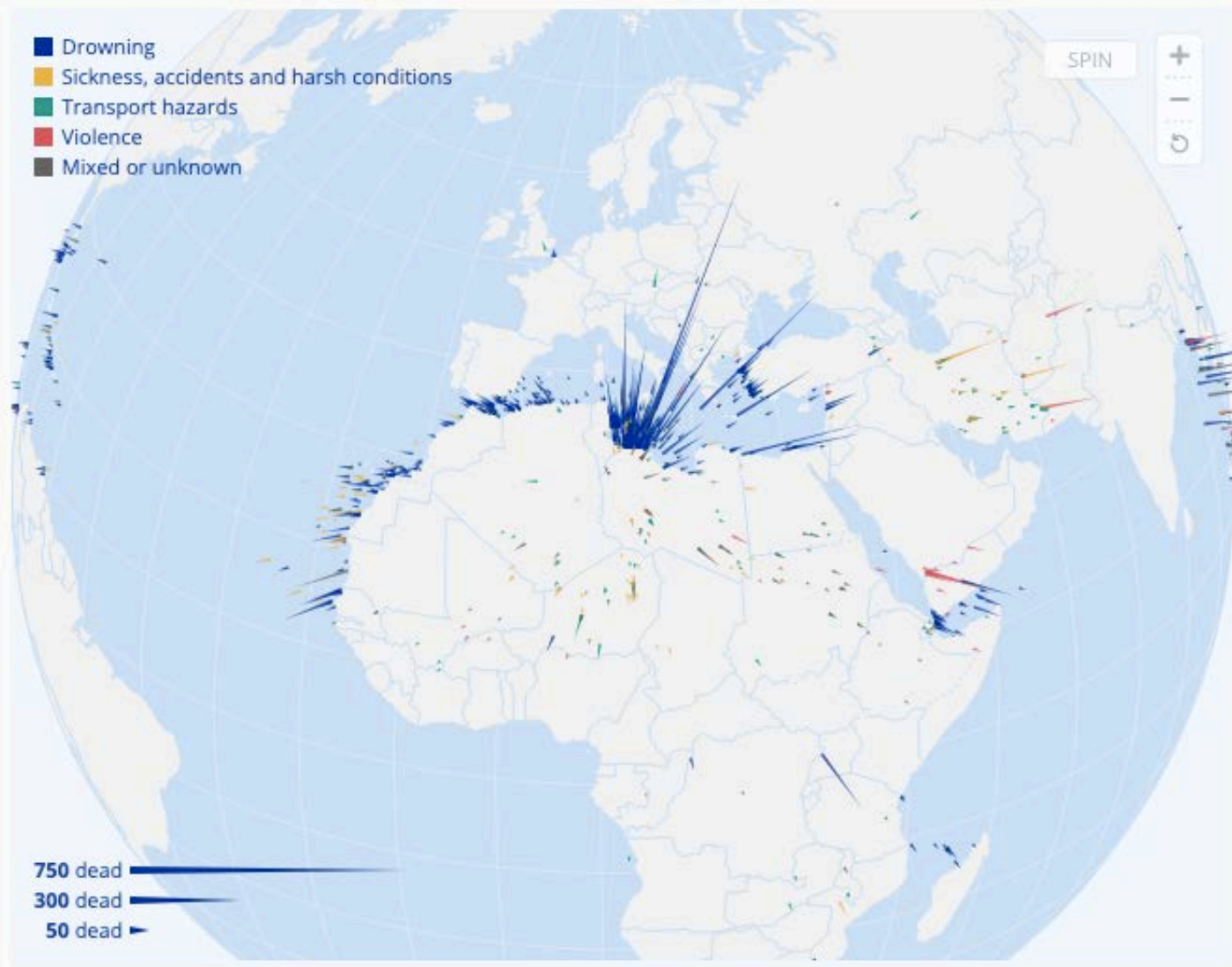

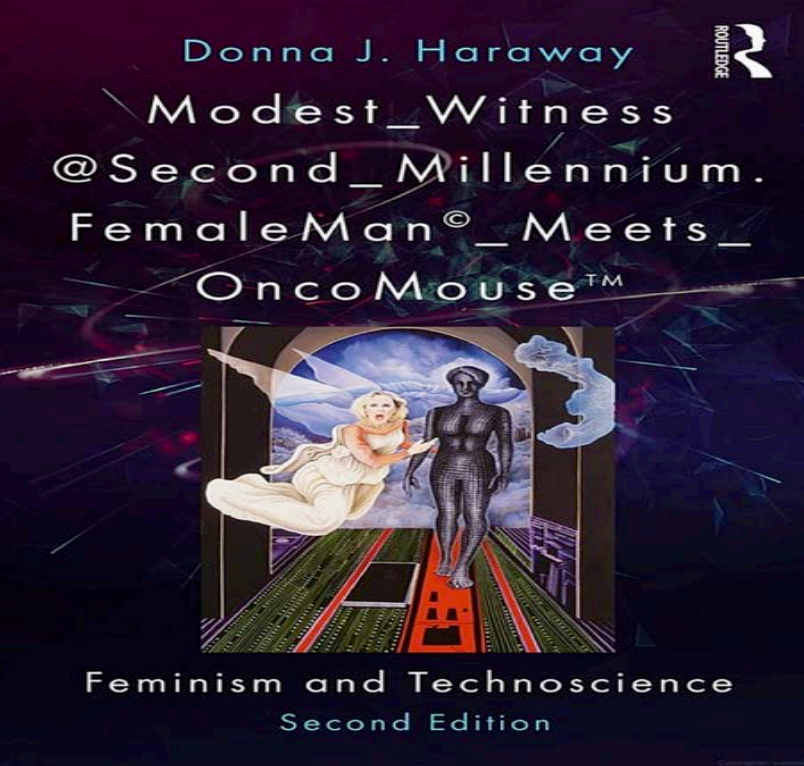

From “God-trick” →  
“partial view”, as a “modest witness”

“Situated knowledge” →  
making accountable, reflexive, located knowledge claims

e.g. reflect on how taking nation state as starting point  
risks “methodological nationalism”

## Taking a stance: epistemological considerations

Cf. Foucault, knowledge = power

“The knowledge which a discourse produces constitutes a kind of power, exercised over those who are ‘known’. When that knowledge is exercised in practice, those who are ‘known’ in a particular way will be subject (i.e. subjected) to it. This is always a power-relation.” (Hall, in ‘The West and The Rest’, 205)

### Abstract

The mass migrations of 2015 were not merely a watershed moment for 'EUrope' but also for the scholarly study of migration to EUrope. With academic expertise and insights becoming much sought-after in the media and political discourse, migration scholarship has gained in unknown popularity over recent years. This current 'migration knowledge hype' has particularly benefited scholarship that claims to be of relevance for EUropean policymakers in finding responses to 'migratory pressures'. This article critically interrogates the increasing intimacy between the worlds of migration scholarship and migration policy and seeks to unpack how the quest for policy-relevance has shaped the process of research itself. The impact of policy on migration research can be discerned when policy categories, assumptions, and needs constitute the bases and (conceptual) frames of research that seeks to be legible to policymakers. However, with EUropean migration policies causing devastation and undeniably harmful effects on migrant lives, what is the responsibility of researchers for the knowledge they produce and disseminate? Should the 'do no harm' principle prevalent in the migration discipline be expanded to also include the potentially harmful consequences resulting from research made relevant to migration policy-makers? This article makes the case for an engaged scholarship that does not shy away from intervening in the contested field of migration with the intention not to fix but to amplify the epistemic and other crises of the EUropean border regime.

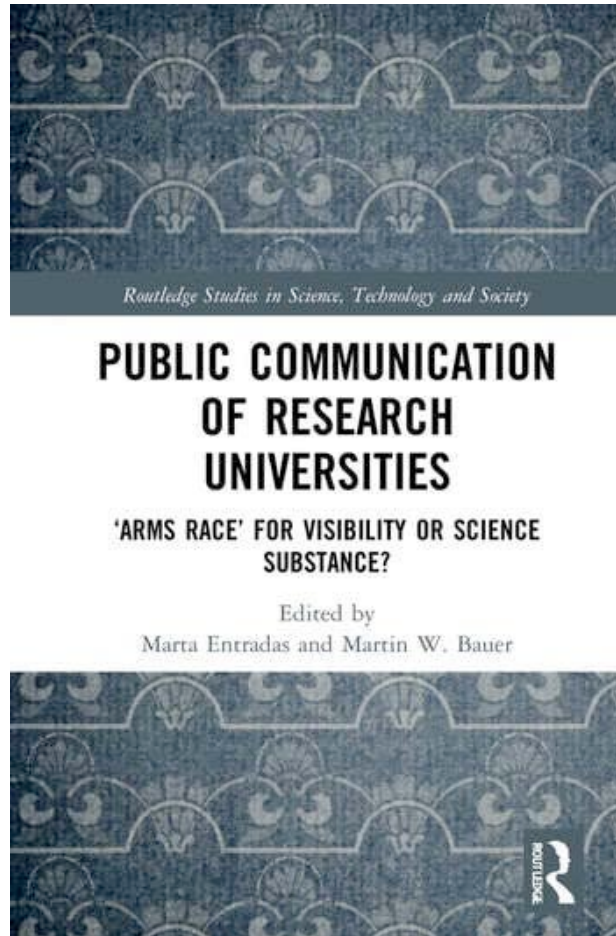

# Politics of impact & rules of engagement of public engagement



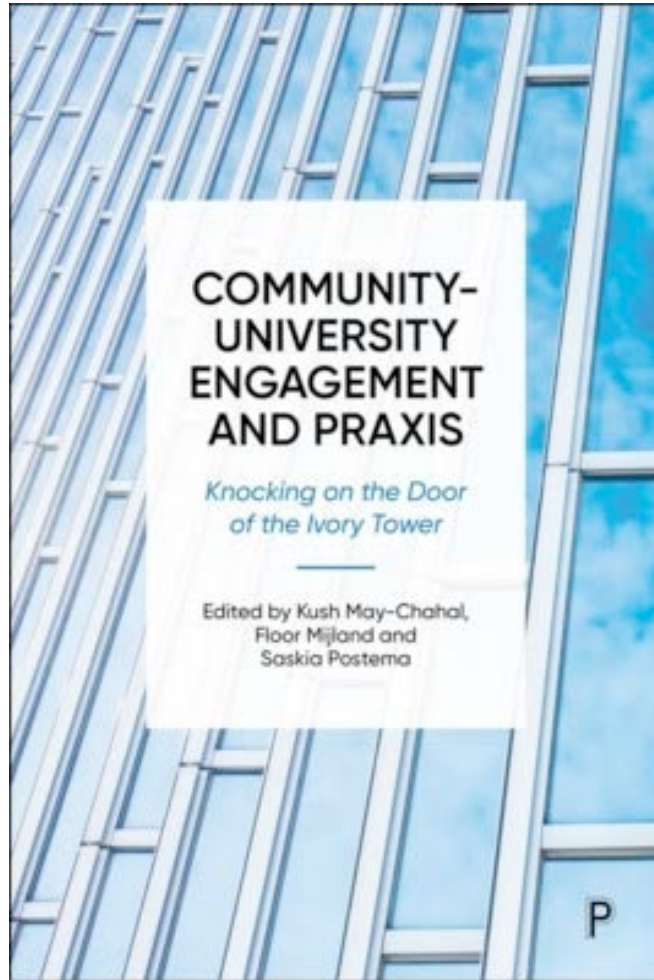
“There is a **Terra nullius** a “nobody’s land” in terms of institutional public engagement implementation and coordination. This Terra Nullius sits between an “arms race” to public engagement resources at the level of RIs, “boots on the ground” of individual researchers and the “top marching orders” from the top policy stakeholders—namely, the Ministry and the Research Funding organisations.”

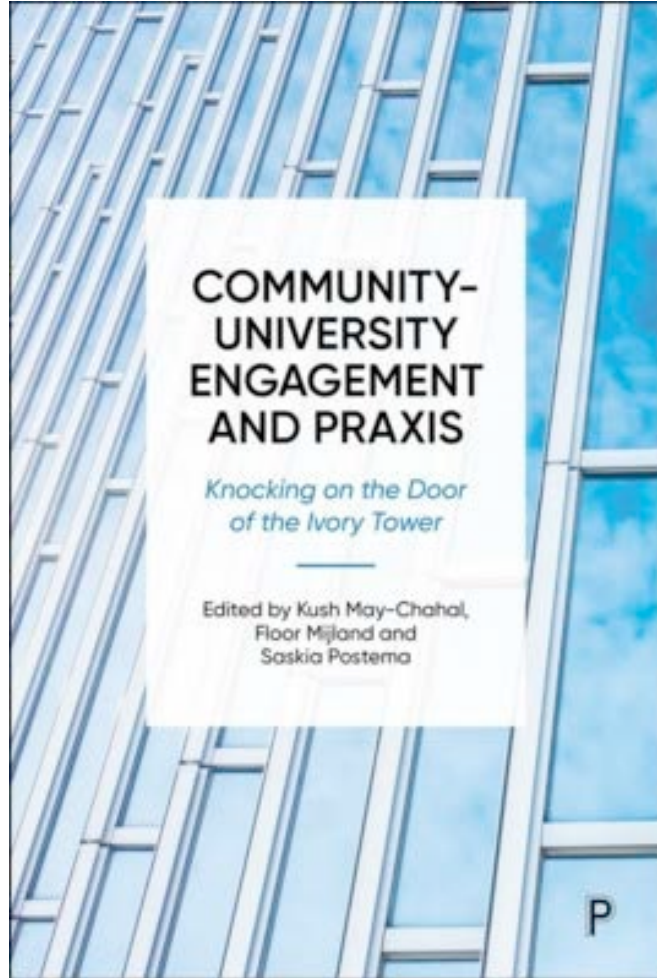
# Politics of impact & rules of engagement of public engagement

“the socially engaged researcher interacts with different stakeholders and is confronted with differing – at times competing – agendas. Researchers engage in the ‘politics of impact’. This engagement raises issues about the changing role of researchers and calls for revisiting their capacities, their ability to maintain integrity, their objectives and how these affect the core mission of truth seeking and fact finding.”

# Politics of impact & rules of engagement of public engagement



1. *Safeguarding independence:*  
Ensure that the research – formulating questions, gathering, analyzing data and presentation of outcomes – is not unduly influenced by external stakeholders.
2. *Procedural guidelines:*  
Ensure that external stakeholders know and agree with existing academic codes of conduct.
3. *Collective reflection with collaborative partners:*  
Acknowledge the need for collective reflection around dilemmas and create room for this reflection in collaborations
4. *Professional competence:*  
Ensure formative training for developing professional attitude and awareness of the academic ethos.
5. *Personal autonomy:*  
Allow researchers to refuse a collaboration with certain stakeholders on ethical grounds (veto right), without it hurting their career prospects.
